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The "Family Skills" project

The Family Skills project, carried out within the ERASMUS + KA204 Program, Strategic Partnership for Adult Education, is aimed at strengthening the strategies for preventing discomfort related to parenting, based on the enhancement of skills, of new parents and new families, identified as the main potential subjects at risk. In particular, the Family Skills project promotes parenting support actions with respect to emerging educational needs, through training and information activities aimed at public and private operators involved in the education of parents and educational figures of children aged 0-6.

The project also intends to carry out a specific support and training activity aimed at public and private operators (such as adult educators) in order to provide organizational and management tools and skills to create training courses on parenting skills and awareness/motivation courses for parents. The envisaged actions intend to exploit the potential of technological innovation to provide cutting-edge solutions in the training field, in particular through Virtual Reality and Augmented Reality techniques as they are immersive and more effective for learning purposes.

The project partnership is made up of public and private bodies from four countries: in addition to the lead organization Unione degli Assessorati, the Italian partner is the Association for Social Mobilization ONLUS, the Romanian private Sorangeli Trans SRL, the Parents' Association of European European Network of Belgium and the Polish Foundation Fundacja Come on Dzieciom Sile (Poland).

Finding Nemo

Year of production: 2003

"Finding Nemo" is a charming animated film produced by Pixar in 2003. The story is set in the waters of the Coral Sea and focuses on Marlin, a shy widowed clownfish, and his young son Nemo. After Nemo is captured by a scuba diver and taken from his natural habitat to be kept as a pet in an aquarium, Marlin bravely sets out on an extraordinary adventure to bring his son home. On his journey, Marlin meets Dory, a surgeon fish with short-term memory problems, and together they face multiple challenges to save Nemo.

the message

"Finding Nemo" addresses universal themes such as courage, unconditional parental love, the importance of independence and self-discovery. The film teaches us the importance of overcoming fears and facing life's challenges, demonstrating how union and friendship can help us overcome any obstacle. At the same time, the film offers a reflection on the fragility of marine ecosystems and the need to protect marine life and their habitat.

What does this film want to teach us?

"Finding Nemo" teaches us the importance of letting go of our fears and worries and relying on others. Marlin, who is originally an overprotective and anxious fish, learns to trust others and embrace the unknown. Furthermore, the film reminds us that individual differences should not be grounds for discrimination or exclusion, but should be celebrated as part of what makes the world a unique and interesting place.

- What are the best ways to convey to my children awareness of the importance of protecting the environment and marine fauna?

Inside Out

Year of production: 2015

"Inside Out", produced by Pixar in 2015, is an outstanding animated film that takes us on a unique journey inside the mind of a young girl named Riley. The story takes place primarily in her mind, where Riley's emotions - Joy, Sadness, Anger, Disgust and Fear - work together to help her deal with the changes she is experiencing in her life following a move. Throughout the film, we see how these emotions interact and how Riley learns to understand and manage her feelings.

the message

"Inside Out" sends us a profound message about the importance and normality of human emotions. The film shows how all emotions, even those considered negative, are essential for personal growth and for facing life's challenges. By teaching children and adults to recognize and understand their emotions, the film promotes greater awareness of self and one's emotional experiences.

What does this film want to teach us ?

The film teaches us that it is normal to experience a wide range of emotions and that it is essential to accept and deal with these emotions instead of repressing them. Riley's story reminds us of the importance of facing changes and difficulties with empathy, patience and an open mind. Additionally, "Inside Out" encourages us to pay attention to the emotions of the people around us and to be compassionate and supportive in their times of need.

Year of production: 2017

"Coco" is a touching animated film produced by Pixar in 2017. The story follows the adventures of Miguel, a young Mexican boy with dreams of becoming a musician, despite his family having banned music for generations. During the Día de los Muertos, Miguel finds himself mysteriously catapulted into the World of the Dead, where he embarks on an extraordinary journey in search of his family roots and the blessing of an ancestor haunted by his passion for music.

the message

"Coco" gives us a powerful message about the importance of family, tradition and memory. The film celebrates the special bond between generations and reminds us of the importance of honoring and remembering our ancestors, as they preceded us and helped define who we are today. Furthermore, "Coco" explores the fulfillment of dreams and the challenge of pursuing one's passion in an authentic and respectful way of family roots.

What does this film want to teach us?

The film teaches us the importance of understanding and respecting our cultural and family heritage. the message

Year of production: 2013

"Frozen" is an animated film produced by Walt Disney Animation Studios in 2013. The story is set in the kingdom of Arendelle and focuses on the special bond between two sisters, Elsa and Anna. Elsa has the power to control ice and snow, but due to an accident, she is afraid of hurting the people around her and isolates herself to protect them. When the kingdom is engulfed in eternal winter due to Elsa's powers, Anna embarks on an adventure to bring her sister back and bring summer back to Arendelle .

the message

"Frozen" conveys a touching message about love, self-acceptance and the strength of family ties. The film explores the themes of self-acceptance, overcoming personal fears and having the courage to be yourself. Furthermore, "Frozen" teaches us that true and unconditional love, especially that between family members, has the power to warm hearts and dissolve barriers.

What does this film want to teach us?

The Lion King

Year of production: 1994

"The Lion King" is a classic animated film produced by Walt Disney Animation Studios in 1994. After a series of tragic events, Simba is falsely accused of causing the death of his father Mufasa and flees the kingdom. the message

the message

the message

Each family member possesses a unique magical power, except Mirabel . When the house's magic begins to fade, Mirabel sets out on a journey to uncover the secret behind the loss of magical powers and to prove that you don't have to have extraordinary powers to be special.

the message

" Encanto " conveys a powerful message about self-acceptance and the importance of feeling loved and valued for who you truly are. History teaches that every individual is special, even without possessing extraordinary abilities, and that the strength of family and love can overcome any difficulty. Furthermore, " Encanto " reminds us of the importance of celebrating our differences and appreciating the authenticity of each individual.

Piper

Year of production: 2016

"Piper" is an animated short film produced by Pixar Animation Studios, which premiered in theaters in 2016 before the feature film "Finding Dory" began . the message

"Juno" delivers a moving message about adolescence, difficult choices and unconditional love. The film teaches that the choices we make can be complicated and that facing the consequences of these choices requires courage and maturity. Furthermore, "Juno" reminds us of the importance of having the support of friends and family when we face difficult times.

What does this film want to teach us?

The film teaches us the importance of taking responsibility for our actions and making informed choices, even when these may seem difficult. Juno shows courage and maturity in dealing with her pregnancy and adopting a realistic perspective on motherhood. Furthermore, "Juno" reminds us of the importance of social and family support when we face difficult times in our lives.

Questions to reflect together

- How can I help my children develop maturity and responsibility in their choices, even when these can be complicated?
- How can I be a loving and compassionate support for my children as they go through difficult times or have to make important choices in their lives?
- What ways can be done to foster open communication with my children and to help them express their emotions and concerns?
- How can I show my children the importance of being authentic and making decisions based on their values and feelings, even when this may require courage and determination?

" This Is Us " conveys a profound message about love, family and the importance of interpersonal relationships. The series teaches that each family member has their own story and path, but that they are linked by a unique and indissoluble bond. Addressing themes like love, loss, acceptance and forgiveness, the series reminds us that family connections can be an anchor of stability and support in times of trouble.

What does this series want to teach us?

The series teaches us the importance of being present in the lives of our loved ones and supporting them in times of joy and difficulty. " This Is Us " shows us how our actions and choices can have a significant impact on the lives of the people we love. - What ways can be done to help my children understand and accept the differences and challenges each of them may face?
- How can I show my children that life's sad and difficult moments can be faced together, finding comfort and support in each other?
